*If you are a parent with school age children or youth, you may be wondering, "What is a believer to do with such a short summer?" Here are a few of the simplest thoughts and reminders...*

1. First and foremost, stay faithful in your daily walk with Christ. Short or long, your walk with Christ is DAILY; even moment by moment. Therefore, you and your kids should make growing in Christ a priority in all planned or spontaneous activities.

**B.** Take some time to rise earlier on a Sunday morning and take a barefoot walk in your yard with the kids before breakfast. Remind yourself that prior to the fall that Adam and Eve walked with God in the cool of the morning... as you rinse your feet thank the Lord that one day you will enjoy His presence in Heaven, and be prepared to worship Him later as you attend church. (You may even catch yourself wanting to take your shoes off when you worship...)

**C.** Don't forget to give. Okay, sure, you should tithe, but what about your time and your gifts? The summer is a great time to step forward and ask if your child's preschool or children's leader would like a Sunday off during the summer. Or just stop in to help out with activities or snacks. It's also a great time to get to know the kids and find out where you could be ministering when fall arrives.

4. Do something special with the kids in your home. Paint a hallway, cook a special meal, camp out in the den, stay up late one night watching the sky... make a memory. There are loads of ideas on Christian websites. And there are many families who have done this kind of stuff for years. Get to know them and ask about ideas. Families who have fun together don't mind sharing their fun-time secrets... and they enjoy seeing other smiling families too... and some of the best ideas are easy on the budget!
